What does it mean to be wise? On September 11<sup>th</sup> we will begin a sermon series on the book of Proverbs. The series will seek to help us answer this question and point us in the direction of living a life of wisdom. Why look to proverbs? What wisdom looks like is what Proverbs is all about. At the beginning of the book of Proverbs it states its purpose:

*for gaining wisdom and instruction;*

*for understanding words of insight;*

<sup>3</sup> *for receiving instruction in prudent behavior,*

*doing what is right and just and fair;*

<sup>4</sup> *for giving prudence to those who are simple,*

*knowledge and discretion to the young—*

<sup>5</sup> *let the wise listen and add to their learning,*

*and let the discerning get guidance—*

<sup>6</sup> *for understanding proverbs and parables,*

*the sayings and riddles of the wise. (Proverbs 1:2-6 NIV)*



So, the purpose of Proverbs is to help us gain insight in living a life that is prudent, right and fair. Now to be prudent simply means acting in a way that shows care or thought for the future. In other words, making decisions with the future consequences in mind. Acting in the right way means doing the correct thing and I'm pretty sure we all know or think we know what it means to act in a fair or equitable way towards others.

But here is the claim of Proverbs – we aren't wise naturally – we need to be trained in and grow into wisdom. This training begins with a proper understanding and respect for God as Proverbs goes on to say in verse 7: "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction." So if we want to be truly wise in our lives we should recognize our need for instruction and training in wisdom and how true wisdom works itself out in the world. This will be the goal of the sermon series, to help us consider what wisdom looks like and how it is lived out in our daily lives – allowing the instruction of Proverbs to guide and teach us along the way.
